What a busy and exciting half term we have had in Reception! We started off with our 'People who help us' topic, thinking of all the people and workers who help us in everyday life from doctors to shop workers to lollipop people. The children enjoyed learning about different roles and acting them out in our role play area. We then moved on to learning about the post office with the build up to Christmas, thinking about what the postal service do with the parcels and letters. The children worked so hard for our Nativity performances, learning songs, actions and their

speaking parts – we are very proud of the children. Well done Reception, have a wonderful Christmas!











In Geography, Year 1 have learnt lots about hot and cold places. As part of this learning, we made a moving postcard for Sunny the Meerkat to send to his family.

Earlier in the half term, we enjoyed a visit from some feathery friends. We have been learning about nocturnal and diurnal animals in Science and did you know, not all owls are nocturnal? It all depends on their eye colour!

We have been reading lots of books in our English lessons and one of our favourites is We're Going on a Bear Hunt. We loved our trip to The Lowry to see the live show.

We wish everyone a Merry Christmas and look forward to lots of new learning in January.















Year 2 have worked extremely hard this half term learning all about famous people including Neil Armstrong, Matthew Henson and Guy Fawkes. We had a special visit from Neil Armstrong himself who told us all about his mission to the moon. In Art, we have been creating pieces of work inspired by the famous people we have learnt about. We have used different skills and media to create pieces using paint, sculpture and collage. In Science, we have learnt all about materials and all their properties and uses. Over the last couple of weeks, we have worked hard learning the songs and our lines for the Christmas production. It has been so lovely to see all of Year 2 grow in confidence when speaking in front of a large group. Year 2 wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! Year three have been extremely busy this half term. In English, the children have been writing some amazing non-chronological reports about the Stone Age, play scripts and persuasive letters. This half term in Science the children have been learning about light and dark. They experimented with torches to see which surfaces are more reflective than others. In History, the children have been learning about the three stages of the Stone Age along with the Bronze and Iron Age. In R.E the children have been discussing and learning about how people celebrate their different religions. In art with Miss Pickup, the children have been learning how to draw various objects from the Stone Age, made pots from clay and have recently designed beautiful Christmas cards. Finally, during assessment week, the children completed a range of tests. Their determination and focus was absolutely fantastic and Mrs Byard and Mr Hargreaves are very proud!
















This half term Year 4 have continued with our Romans topic; we learnt that they ate some unusual foods and created a menu for a banquet, found out about life as a Roman soldier, discussed how the Celts and Romans had different opinions on Boudicca and made our own mini mosaics based on Roman designs. In Science we learnt all about electricity creating simple circuits to make bulbs light and carried out an investigation into conductors and insulators; we also took part in a Science workshop when we learnt where electricity comes from and how it gets into our houses. In our English lessons we wrote short stories based on The Day I swapped my Dad for Two Goldfish and described Pompeii before and after the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. In Maths we learnt how to calculate area and perimeter, identified different angles and perfected our skills when rounding numbers.

Year 5 are reading Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo and we have enjoyed writing our own contrasting description about a desert island during the day and during the night. We have been working hard to master fractions and multiples in Maths and we have been looking at how humans change as they age. We even used an APP to see what we would look like in 30 years' time – it was so much fun! We have been learning new ball skills in PE and new Christmas vocabulary in Spanish – Feliz Navidad! In Computing, we created a database for animals in the rainforest, linking to our Geography topic on the Amazon. Our highlight was our trip to Whitworth Art Gallery in Manchester where we created our own wallpaper art print.






