We have been learning all about traditional tales this term in Nursery, including Goldilocks and the three bears, Little red riding hood and the three little pigs. We have been detectives to find out who ate little bear's porridge, we also had a breakfast morning where we all tried porridge ourselves. We have been practising our independent writing skills and learning all about length and mass in maths. Nursery also enjoyed dressing up and reading lots of stories for world book day.









What a fantastic half term Reception have had! We particularly enjoyed our Traditional Tales topic, where we acted out the story of Goldilocks and The Three Bears, produced some wonderful writing based on The Three Billy Goats Gruff and we even got to make our own gingerbread men biscuits! World Book Day was celebrated in Reception, by reading lots of books throughout the day, reading outside, writing our own book reviews and illustrating our own book front covers. In Maths, Reception have been busy learning about doubling, halving, money, counting in 2s and odd and even numbers. We particularly enjoyed setting up our own shop and buying food with the coins we had learned about. We concluded the half term by learning all about Easter. We found out why Easter is celebrated, how people celebrate and we followed the recipes we wrote in Literacy to make our very own Easter treats. Well done Reception – have a lovely half term break!







In History, Year 1 have enjoyed learning about toys from the past and have produced some lovely drawings of teddy bears in their Art lessons.

Also in Art, Year 1 have practised their weaving skills and made their own clay tile.

Year 1 have been reading 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' in English. They did a brilliant job of retelling the story and enjoyed making glove puppet characters in their Design Technology lessons.

In Science, Year 1 have conducted lots of investigations to find out about uses of everyday materials. They had lots of fun during their 'Magnificent Materials' workshop where they built a house for the three little pigs. Were they strong enough to withstand the huffing and puffing from the big bad wolf?







Year 2 have had a fantastic half term and have been so busy with all their new learning. We had an amazing trip to Knowsley Safari Park where we watched a spectacular Sealion display and saw the cheeky meerkats and lazy lions. We have been learning about conservation in Science and have made our own flowerbombs to attract bumblebees to our school Nature Garden. In Geography we have explored the country of Kenya; its amazing natural features and how our life differs from a child who lives in Nairobi. We've enjoyed reading 'Handa's Surprise' and 'The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark' in our Writing lessons. We continue to practise our recorders in Music lessons and have been practising our beats on different percussion instruments. 
Can you spot the sealion!?




In Year 3 the children have been learning about plants in Science. They have learnt the parts of a plant, the role of the roots and why plants have leaves. They enjoyed a trip to Martin Mere and became plant investigators. In Geography, the children have been learning about Europe and its countries. The children labelled a map using atlases and found out about what life is like around the Mediterranean. In English, the children have been learning about the story, Theseus and the Minotaur. The children then designed their own Greek monster and created their own Greek Myth. Everyone in Year 3 enjoyed the World Book Day activities. The children have had the

pleasure of being taught Flag Football in P.E with Mr Myring. After such a busy term, everyone is looking forward to a well











This half term in English, Year 4 have been writing a suspense piece linked to the mighty warrior 'Beowulf' defeating the terrible monster Grendel. We have been learning how to divide using the bus stop method and revisiting rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. In Science, we have been learning about the digestive system and the different functions of the teeth in the human body. Year 4 have also been learning all about The Vikings and their perilous rule. This included a visit from a Viking warrior. The children in Year 4 have been studying animation in Computing and we have been developing skills communicating the weather in Spanish. The Year 4 classes have also been working hard on identifying pitch, rhythm and notation in Music.









Year 5 have had a fantastic Spring 2. They have been continuing to read the text 'Holes' by Louis Sachar and have enjoyed drafting an argument about why Camp Green Lake is an unacceptable place for children to stay. They have also explored the story 'The Egyptian Cinderella' and dressed up for World Book Day, where we had several Harry Potter characters turn up! In Maths, they have been working hard to master graphs and measurement and have been continuing to develop their Mental Maths skills. In Science, they have been looking at properties of materials and have discussed how to separate mixtures and examples of reversible and irreversible changes. They have been learning lots of new gymnastic skills in PE and had a visit from Life Education to discuss mental wellbeing. During their Geography topic, they have been learning about the River Nile and have discussed its location and its journey through 11 countries. In Spanish, they have learnt about different cities in Spain have shown confidence in giving a weather report for the cities. In Art, the children have produced wonderful artwork with Miss Pickup linked to the Egyptians. Year 5 have especially enjoyed their trips and visitors this term. They have been to the National Football Museum and have visited St John's Community Centre for an Easter experience.







This half term, Year 6 have been working extremely hard in preparation for their SATs. They have all shown such resilience in their learning and a determination to succeed to reach their full potential. In English, we continued exploring the wonderful book 'The Island' by Armin Greder. Within this, we have developed our formal and persuasive language to write a letter to the characters. We also celebrated World Book Day by exploring graphic novels, watching a live author discuss her own graphic novel and created our own. In Science, we have been investigating how fossils are made and even made some of our own!
