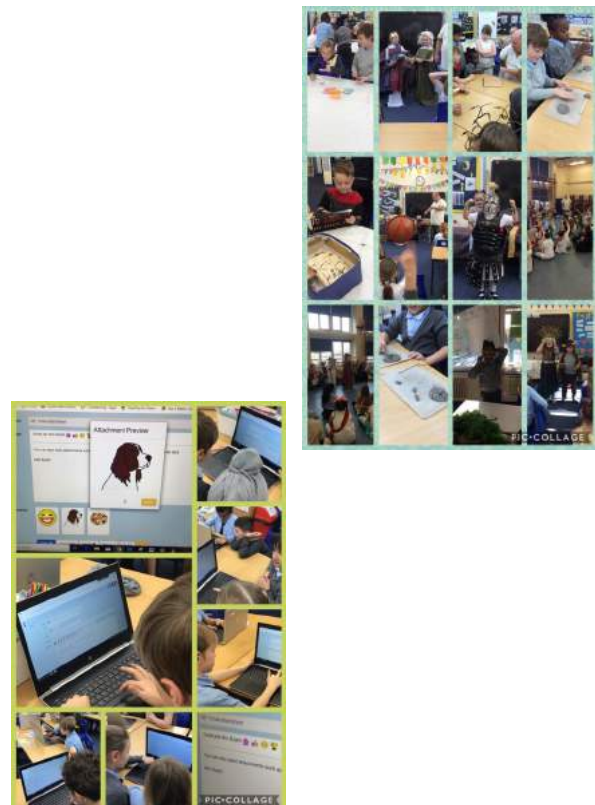

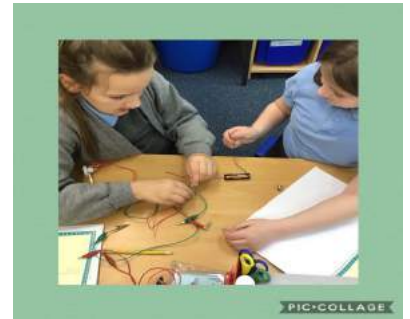
# Year 3

Year 3 have had a busy half-term. We enjoyed Ancient Greek day where we learned about life in Athens and Sparta, put on a play, made a Greek coin and played some ancient games. In Geography this half-term we have learned about Europe and looked at what life is like in different countries. As part of this, in Computing, we sent emails about an imaginary trip to Paris. We also looked at the work of artist Georges Seurat and created a piece of work in his style. We enjoyed our visit to St. John's Church to learn about the Christmas story. Next term we are learning about the Stone Age and will be visiting Liverpool museum- details to follow.



# YEAR 4

Year 4 have really enjoyed their topic, learning all about the Romans. Our favourite part was our trip to Chester where we looked around the museum at some Roman artefacts and marched through the streets as a Roman soldier! In English, we have described Pompeii before the eruption in 79AD and after. We also performed a Christmas poem in front of the whole school. We recapped anti-bullying in PSHE and we had a visit from the Science Dome to find out all about light and how it travels. As we have been learning all about electricity in Science, we made our own 'Buzz' game using wires and a bulb. Finally, we performed our Christmas play; Shine Star, Shine - which we hope you enjoyed!



# Year 5

Year 5 have thoroughly enjoyed Autumn term. In English, we read Kensuke's Kingdom by 'Michael Morpurgo', which we used to draw inspiration from for our own writing. We have written from the perspective of the main character, produced a newspaper article and described the island from the story. In Maths, we have approached all of our learning with an enthusiasm and resilience. In Science, we have explored how we change as we get older and we now also have a confident understanding of Space. We produced moon buggies in our Space topic, which was one of our favourite lessons. In Geography, we have learnt all about the USA and why people visit the incredible city of New York. In Autumn 2, we explored the rainforest and why the Amazon is so important and must be protected. In Spanish, we have been able to use phrases to give an opinion, as well as recapping the days of the week, colours and numbers. We had a fantastic time on our trip to Whitworth Art Gallery, where we explored the wallpaper collection and used the artwork to inspire our own wallpaper designs. We took part in a textiles workshop, using different materials and sewing techniques to create a wallpaper.



# Year 6

Year 6 have had a brilliant half-term with lots of fun packed in. They have learnt about why the Mayan civilisation came to an end in History, created their own points-based games using coding in Computing and we learnt all about our respiratory and circulatory systems in Science. All of Year 6 have developed their singing and drama skills when preparing for our Christmas play, 'Panto Pandemonium' and their speaking and listening skills when preparing to perform the poem, 'How the Grinch stole Christmas' by Dr Seuss.

In addition to all of this, Year 6 visited Crucial Crew where they learnt about the importance of staying safe and following rules and regulations on public transport. Whilst there, they also learnt how easy it is to have your personal devices stolen when walking home from school and how to administer basic first aid.
