### **Communication with school**

To keep you up to date it is vital that you download the Parent Connect app so you get ALL our school news and updates. Please email the school office if you need assistance with this.

You will receive a newsletter from your child's new class teacher introducing themselves and highlighting the learning they will cover this term so you can help support them further at home. Teachers will be available each day at drop off and collection to receive any messages or for a quick catch-up.

Parents can call or email school if you have any questions or queries and a member of the team will endeavour to respond within 24 hrs of your request.

Meet the teacher sessions - please see Autumn 1 calendar for your child's session. Please do try to drop in to see your child's teacher and classroom; it will only last 10 minutes at the end of the day and gives you the opportunity to ask your child's new class teacher any questions you may have. Nursery and Reception have their stay and play sessions this week.

Parent-Teacher consultations will be organised in October (please see the calendar of events) and March. You will receive an End of Year report in July.

Can I remind parents that if you wish to discuss your children's personal or academic development at any time throughout the school year to please see your child's class teacher and they will arrange a convenient time with you. If you wish to discuss a concern further, after speaking with the class teacher, please contact the school office and an appointment can be arranged with a senior member of staff.

We politely ask that parents **do not use social media** to discuss any matters regarding Bridgewater School. Contacting school directly means we can deal promptly with your queries in a positive and constructive manner. The school has no connection with any social media accounts (including the Bridgewater Parents' Facebook page) except our twitter page @BridgewaterPS.

### **Updating School Systems**

We ask that you inform school if your contact details have changed or if you wish to change the adults you have listed to collect your child. In order to make sure we have your most up to date information, data collection sheets will be available in your child's classroom on the day of the meet the teacher sessions. Please check the information carefully and return the form **only** if there are any changes.

Only children in Years 5 and 6, who have provided written consent from parents, are permitted to walk home alone.

### **Attendance and Punctuality**

Regular school attendance is an important part of giving your child the best possible start in life and vital for your child's education - as a lost day can never be repeated. Our school shares the government's determination to raise the levels of pupil attendance and has robust systems in place to monitor attendance and punctuality.

Most of our children attend school regularly and do not present any concerns. However, if your child's attendance dips below 95% or accumulates 5 days (10 sessions) of unauthorised absence, you may be asked to attend an Attendance Panel Meeting in school to explain the reasons for absences further. It is therefore, very important that you contact the office on each day of absence to ensure that the absence is recorded as 'authorised'. Failure to engage with school on improving your child's attendance may result in fine/legal proceedings.

**All holiday requests during term time will not be granted in line with Government legislation and following Salford Local Authority Policies. Please see the school website for a copy of our attendance policy**

Good punctuality is also very important. The school day starts at 8.40am and all children are expected to be in school by this time (we open the doors at 8.30am to make this a little easier for families). Valuable teaching input can be missed and the **whole class** disrupted by a late arrival. To help limit disruption, all late arrivals are taken to class at times so not to disturb current learning.

Please continue to support us with Strong Attendance at School and ensure your child is in school and on time each day. Early intervention and parental support are key factors in resolving attendance issues. Should you have any difficulty with this please make an appointment to see Miss Hopkins (Attendance Manager) via the school office.

### **Breakfast Club**

Our breakfast club launched in 2015 in partnership with Greggs Foundation - who continue to fund the provision so we can offer a free Breakfast club. **The main focus of our breakfast club and the funding from Greggs is to give pupils the opportunity of accessing a healthy, nutritious breakfast free of charge to ensure they start their morning on the right track.** We are able to offer 40 places to pupils who would benefit from a free meal. We operate a booking system rather than a walk-in system to ensure staff ratios are accurate. We are unable to prioritise working families for wraparound care purposes so would suggest contacting a local provider if you are unsuccessful in securing one of the limited places.

### **Afterschool Clubs**

At Bridgewater, we have a number of exciting and enriching afterschool clubs that children can sign up to each half term – most clubs are free and others have a nominal charge of £1 per week. Letters are sent out each half term via PA Connect. Please note our Autumn 1 clubs are already full. However, please keep an eye out for our Autumn 2 communication, which will be sent before we finish for October half term.

### **School meals, Water Bottles and Snacks**

Just a reminder to order your child's meals on Evolve before 8.30am on the day. We would suggest ordering meal options together **with your child** to ensure that they are happy with what you have ordered for them.

All children are encouraged to drink water during the day. The children are able to re-fill their water bottles from fountains around school. Children may also bring in healthy snacks to have during their break times. We try to encourage good eating habits and have a Healthy Eating Policy that supports this aim. Children in Key Stage 1 and EYFS are provided with fresh fruit daily; any extras are shared with KS2.

**\*Just a reminder that we are a nut-free school as we have children with nut allergies\***

### **Homework**

Homework is important as it shows the children the value that you place on their learning and helps them to consolidate key skills. Thank you to all those parents who support their children in reading every night; learning their spellings/number facts

and multiplication tables; completing homework tasks and projects. Any junior child (Years 3-6) who does not complete their weekly homework to an acceptable standard will be required to do so during Friday lunchtime supervised by a senior member of staff.

### **PE kits**

All children from Reception to Year 6 require a PE kit in school to participate in physical education (PE). If a child does not have their PE kit, they will be offered a spare from our school resources.

### **Parents' Forum**

Our Parent Forum aims to represent the views of all parents. It facilitates communication between parents/carers and staff and governors. The forum works to provide feedback on provision, offer a parent's perspective on current policy and practice and input into decision making and planning for future provision. It is not a forum to discuss individual/personal issues. The first meeting will be held on **30<sup>th</sup> September at 2.30pm** in the school hall. Tea, coffee and biscuits will be available. I hope to see many of you there.

### **Children's University Update**

This year we are delighted to be continuing with our participation in the Children's University Programme. The Children's University encourages children to 'learn outside of the school day' and recognises their commitment to enhancing their own learning. Your child will have received a 'Learning Passport' to use as a record of their additional learning. This passport will be used all the way through school and onto Secondary school if their school is part of the programme. If your child has lost their passport, a replacement may be purchased at the school office at the cost of £2.50 (school had purchased the first passport on your child's behalf). Miss Whitfield will keep you updated with any information throughout the year.

### **School Fund and Fund Raising**

School fund is generated by a variety of means. There are fund raising events during the course of each year and we are paid commission by the school photographer and from the sale of school ties, reading folders and PE bags further adds to our income. This year we have also signed up to Asda's Parentkind Scheme – more information on how you can support our school to follow.

Through the judicious spending of School Fund we are able to enhance the curriculum for all children by purchasing additional resources, booking visitors to the school and subsidising trips. All requests from children and staff, for the use of school fund are approved by the Headteacher.

The grand total taken at the Summer Fair was £729.05. Thank you all so much for your generosity – this full amount will be sent to Ronald McDonald House (last year's chosen charity). Miss Morris (our school council coordinator) will let you know this year's chosen charity as soon as this has been agreed with our School Council.

### **Lost Property**

The school acquires a large amount of 'lost property'. All items with names in are returned to their owner and **not** stored in lost property. Therefore, we encourage all parents to ensure that **EVERY** item is clearly labelled with your child's name. If your child has lost an item please speak to the class teacher initially and if this is not within the classroom they will direct you to check with lost property at the school office. If your child brings home an item that is not theirs by mistake, please return this via the class teacher.

### **Bikes/scooters on the playground**

Please can I remind you of our school's request (School Council) that both adults and children dismount and push bikes/scooters when on the school grounds to avoid any accidents or collisions with other parents and children. I would like to also remind you that school does not accept any responsibility for any bikes/scooters left on the school premises. We strongly suggest that all bikes/scooters are locked securely if left on school premises.

### **Play Frames**

The school has a number of play frames on the school playgrounds to help encourage safe adventurous play. All frames are regularly checked to ensure that they meet safety requirements and are age appropriate. The children are also informed on their safe use and are closely supervised during use. The school does not accept any liability for any accidents that occur when used before or after the school day and without school staff supervision.

### **School Development**

Over the Summer, the school has undergone a few developments including a new faster internet system, internal repairs and painting to keep our environment bright and inviting. We have work planned to install 2 outdoor stages for our children to

use – these will be in memory of our pupils Eliza Rowley and Renae Walker. We also have plans to install a MUGA (Multi Use Games Arena) at KS2 and a new trim trail at Key stage 1. The School Council will help us to make design decisions on all these projects.

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# General Information



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As an 'OUTSTANDING school' we believe there are some core expectations that we should share to ensure all our children achieve their full potential.

## Basic Skills

As a member of Bridgewater School we expect all families to undertake the following work at home with their child/children each week:

- Reading with your child every night and bring reading books and records to school each day.
- Complete homework every week.
- Practice handwriting, spelling and key number facts.

## Attendance

Please ensure your child is in school every day in order for them to make the most of the OUTSTANDING learning opportunities on offer.

School opens at 8.30am and lessons start at 8.40am. A free breakfast club is available from 8am every morning (40 places maximum) and must be booked in advanced.

Please report to the main office if you arrive late to school. Children will be taken to their classrooms at a convenient time as not to disrupt learning.

Our identity as an OUTSTANDING school is very important and as such teaching the children to wear the uniform with pride is an important part of this:

## Winter Uniform (September to Easter holidays)

- Light blue shirt / blouse / polo
- School tie (available from the school office)
- Grey trousers / skirt / pinafore
- Grey v-neck jumper / cardigan
- Black flat shoes – not trainers
- White/grey socks / tights

## Jewellery

Jewellery is **not allowed** in school except for watches and stud earrings.

## Hair Styles

All children should present with neat and tidy hairstyles for school.

Mobile phones/electrical devices are not permitted in school

Children take part in PE each week so need their kit in school on their designated PE day. The kit is as follows:

- Plain white t-shirt (no logos)
- Plain black/navy shorts (no logos)
- Trainers (outdoor) / Black pumps (indoor)
- Black/navy jogging bottoms / tracksuit may be worn outside in winter (no logos).

- We do not wear jewellery
