
Year One have had a busy end to the year!










# Year 3 6









## Year 4

This half term in English, Year 4 have been writing a narrative linked to our class novel 'The Lost Happy Endings as well as a character description of the terrible witch. In addition, the children enjoyed exploring poetry linked to 'The Magic Box' by Kit Wright. In Maths, we have been learning about different translations on a grid and mastering our skills linked to money. In Science, we have continued our studying on how living things (both plants and animals) survive in their habitats. Year 4 dived into their Geography learning this half term and they have acquired lots of new knowledge linked to Scandinavia. Both year 4 classes have continued to develop their core strength and flexibility in gymnastics. Finally, Year 4 have enjoyed working with our professional artist, with a focus on Phillip Westcott for this half term's pieces of work.







## Year 5

Year 5 have had a fantastic final term. They have been continuing to read the text 'Wonder' and have written a fantastic biography. They have also drafted a brilliant descriptive piece inspired by the video 'The Lighthouse'. In Maths, they have been working hard to master fractions and have been continuing to recap previous learning and develop their Mental Maths skills. In Science, they have been looking at forces where they have discussed gravity, friction and water resistance and air resistance. They particularly enjoyed our investigation with the parachutes. Year 5 have thoroughly enjoyed their topic on Medieval Britain. They got to visit Tatton Park and experience what life was like in the Medieval period. In Spanish, they have learnt about items of clothing and how they can structure a sentence to describe which clothing they would wear in different countries and climates. In Computing, the children have enjoyed creating their own games. Their favourite part was when they got to play each other's games. They also showed great skill during their digital art workshop.



## **Year** 6

Year 6 have had a jam-packed summer half term. They showed incredible bravery on their residential trip to Lledr Hall. They also enjoyed a trip to Graystones which allowed them to experience some extreme sports and even sparked an interest in some children! In Art, they have been studying the work of Claude Monet and Bruno Catalano, creating their own sculptures and impressionist abstract artwork. Finally, they have put a lot of effort into creating their leavers' assembly which they cannot wait to share with parents and carers on their very last day at Bridgewater.
