



Key Vocabulary	
Country	A country is land that is controlled by a single government. A country can be large or small.
City	A city is a place where many people live closely together. A city offers more jobs, schools and different types of activities than smaller towns and villages.
Town	A place where people live and work. A town has many houses, schools, shops, places of work and places of entertainment. They are usually larger than a village but smaller than a city.
Detached house	A house on its own.
Semi-detached house	Two houses joined together.
Terraced house	A row of houses.
Flats/Apartments	A flat/apartment is part of a larger building with lots of flats/apartments in it.
Bungalow	A single storey house.
