### Key Vocabulary

<i>aerial view</i>	A view from above
<i>Capital city</i>	A place where the government buildings are.
<i>city</i>	A place where people work and live that is larger than a town. Manchester is a city.
<i>coastline</i>	Land along the coast.
<i>house</i>	A building designed for people to live in.
<i>Human geography</i>	Features of land that have been impacted on by human activity.
<i>mainland</i>	An area of land surrounded by other areas of land.
<i>map</i>	A drawing of a particular place
<i>Physical geography</i>	Natural features of land
<i>river</i>	A large, natural stream of fresh water that follows into a sea or lake.
<i>shop</i>	A building in which goods are sold.
<i>seaside</i>	A place by the sea that is usually a beach area or holiday resort

### Key Knowledge

The United Kingdom is in Europe. The United Kingdom has 4 countries: *Scotland*, *England*, *Wales* and *Northern Ireland*. Below is a map of the *seasides* within the UK. They all sit along the *coastline*. There are no *seasides* in Salford as there is no *coastline*

Salford is in the *mainland* of England. Because of this, there is *no coastline* so there are no *seasides*. The nearest *seaside* towns are Blackpool, Formby and Lytham St Annes.
