<b>Bathing machine</b>	Bathing machines were used a long time ago so people could change in private before getting into the sea.
<b>Before</b>	Something that has already happened
<b>Health</b>	Looking after our body and mind.
<b>Holidays</b>	A break away from your house.
<b>Locomotive</b>	A moving engine
<b>Now</b>	Something that is happening today
<b>Past</b>	Something that has already happened
<b>pier</b>	A wooden structure going from land and out over water.
<b>Present</b>	Something that is happening now
<b>Punch and Judy</b>	A traditional British puppet show that would entertain families
<b>Resorts</b>	Somewhere to go on holiday which has places to stay.
<b>Souvenir</b>	Something that is kept as a reminder of a place visited
<b>Victorian era</b>	A 63 year period between 1837-1901 when Queen Victoria ruled.

Key Knowledge
The railways developed so more people began to travel further and visit seaside <b>resorts</b> .
Holidays in the <b>past</b> were nearly always health related. Seawater was considered to have a beneficial effect on health and cure diseases.
There are differences between seaside <b>holidays</b> 100 years ago, 50 years ago and today e.g. different clothes and different entertainment. People got changed in special <b>bathing machines</b>
Women would use <b>bathing machine</b> to change into their swimming costume. In the <b>past</b> people would be covered and wear their clothes to the beach. They did not have shorts and T-shirts to wear. Not many people sunbathed.
Bucket and spades would be very heavy to carry. They were made from metal, tin and wood. Donkey rides, entertainment and carousels on the <b>pier</b> are still popular today
People would watch <b>Punch and Judy</b> shows and walk along the promenade to watch a show, hear a band or sit and rest. <b>Punch and Judy</b> shows can be seen today but very rarely at the beach.

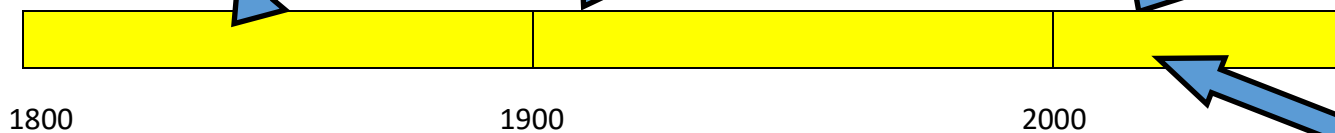
