Key Vocabulary

mixed media	Using a range of materials, e.g. paints and oil pastels.
propaganda art	Art using imagery and words to influence public opinion and behaviour.
street art	Artwork displayed in public on surroundings buildings, streets, public surfaces.
imagery	Representing the world through images.
repetition	Repeated use of a visual element.

Key Artist-Banksy

Banksy is a famous artist who is known for keeping their identity hidden. They create art in secret, even though it is often in busy places. Their work (often about war, politics or other important issues) encourages people to think and reflect about their lives and current society.



'Sweep it Under the Carpet' was made in 2006 on a London wall and is one of Banksy's well-known pieces. It shows a maid sweeping dirt under the cover on a brick wall. It is thought that Banksy intended for it to suggest how he feels some countries ignore serious issues in parts of the world.

Key Skills

- Can they make a record about the styles and qualities in their work?
- Can they say what their work is influenced by?
- Can they overprint using different colours?
- Do they look very carefully at methods they use and make decisions about the effectiveness of their printing methods?
- Do their sketchbooks contain detailed notes, and quotes explaining about items?
- Do they compare their methods to those of others and keep notes in their sketchbooks?
- Do they adapt and refine their work to reflect its meaning and purpose, keeping notes and annotations in their sketchbooks?
- Can they explain why they have combined different tools to create their drawings?
- Can they explain why they have chosen specific drawing techniques?

Key Knowledge

- Different drawing media (e.g. pastels vs pencils) can create different effects.
- Overprinting creates different patterns and textures.

Key Artist-Vanessa Scott

Vanessa Scott is an artist who lives and works in Manchester and Salford. She has designed and painted one of the UK's tallest murals. Murals are painted directly onto the wall, inspired by the shapes of buildings and space around them. Her work is often bold and joyful, using bright colours and graphic or whimsical shapes. She creates artwork to celebrate life or to communicate an idea or a message such as the work she created for the Pankhurst Centre or Black History Month and has even designed a Blue Peter Badge-The Sky is the Limit.
