### English



This term we will be reading the story Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo. We will be completing lots of exciting writing based on the text!

### Maths

We will be focusing on our mental maths skills, particularly the four operations and also looking at number, involving place value, ordering and comparing.

### Spelling and Multiplication

Spellings are included in Friday's homework and are tested in class the following Friday. Children should be encouraged to learn all multiplications by heart and should be tested at home whenever possible.

### P.E

Year 5 will have PE on Tuesday this term. Children are to come to school in their PE kit on these days, wearing a white top and black shorts with trainers or pumps. In the winter months, children can wear tracksuit bottoms and a jumper. Children should still bring a coat to school when they have PE.



### Reading Books

Reading as regularly as possible to an adult can really help your child's progress. We would like to see your child read a minimum of FOUR times a week. Once they have read to an adult, the adult should sign their Pupil Activity Logs.



Homework is set every Friday and should be returned on Tuesday. Please encourage your child to complete their homework to a high standard every week.



### Science

In Science, we will be exploring Earth and Space. We will be looking at the Earth, Sun and the Moon, along with all of the other planets. We will also learn about why we have the different seasons and also day and night. The children will look closely at the Moon and it's phases, and they will also have the opportunity to create a Moon buggy.

### Geography
